Sec. 24. Be it further enacted, That Gustave Nuderer, John Kung, Joseph Voght, Mathias Hefty, and their associates, successors and assigns, be, and are hereby, constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name and style of "Schweitzer Unterstutzungs Verein, (Swiss Relief Society,) in the City of Nashville, County of Davidson, State of Tennessee;" with full power in their said corporate capacity, to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, purchase, and hold, real and personal property, stock, and incorporate hereditaments; and may dispose of the same, in such manner as said association may deem most expedient.

Sec. 25. Be it further enacted, That Gustave Nuderer, John Kung, Joseph Voght, Mathias Hefty, and their associates, successors and assigns, be, and are hereby, constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name and style of "Schweitzer Unterstutzungs Verein, (Swiss Relief Society,) in the City of Nashville, County of Davidson, State of Tennessee;" with full power in their said corporate capacity, to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, purchase, and hold, real and personal property, stock, and incorporate hereditaments; and may dispose of the same, in such manner as said association may deem most expedient.

Sec. 26. Be it further enacted, That the said Schweitzer Unterstutzungs Verein (Swiss Relief Society,) may use a common seal, and change the same at pleasure, and enact, from time to time, such by-laws and regulations as may be required, for the good and government of said society, not inconsistent with the Constitution of the United States, or the State of Tennessee; and perform all other acts for their benefit not inconsistent with the privileges herein granted.
